Havasupai is the premier Desert Stars event of the year!! Have you returned your registration form yet? This year the event is "have-it-your-way" Havasupai, and the registration form provides for you to select one or more or all of the options.

On Saturday, September 13, we start with a "competitive driving" event at the Octane indoor go-cart track. You can zip around the track and show fellow Desert Stars just how "on the edge" you can be, or just watch and cheer your favorite racer on! The light weight chassis go carts feature a center mounted 10,000 RPM electric motor - good for 45 MPH! - and proper disc brakes with LED brake lights to reign the speed in. There will be prizes awarded and we will have a "spectator" area with snacks for the folks who choose not to drive. We will meet at Octane Raceway at 1 PM, 9119 E. Indian Bend Rd, Scottsdale. Racers must be licensed, at least 4'6" tall and race with closed-toe shoes; pants are recommended (rather than skirts or shorts). Price for driving is \$27 per person, price for spectator area snacks and NO driving is \$7 per person.

Dinner Saturday evening will be at the nearby Orange Sky restaurant at Talking Stick Resort. The food is excellent and the view

Mercedes-Benz and the United States have long histories of involvement in international Grand Prix racing. As you have seen in the STAR magazine, Mercedes was amongst the earliest winners of international automobile competition. Similarly, early international competitions such as the Vanderbilt Cup Races were held on a variety of venues in the U.S. Over the years, the U.S Grand Prix races have been held at Sebring, FL, Riverside and Long Beach, CA, Watkins Glen, NY, Detroit, MI, Las Vegas, NV, Phoenix, AZ (of all places!), Indianapolis, IN and now, Austin, TX where the event seems to have achieved the international recognition and financial stability the sponsors of this incredibly expensive sport require. One can see a parallel in Mercedes' involvement which was intense in the early years of the sport, intense again in the politically charged years leading up...

Chaco Canyon National Park

October 17-19, 2014

In addition to its spectacular archaeological resources, Chaco Canyon National Park is naturally significant as one of the few protected areas in the San Juan Basin. It is an island of biodiversity and a preserve to plants and wildlife that have been significantly affected by grazing, mineral extraction, and other land-use activities in the surrounding area.

The fauna found here includes elk, deer, bobcats, rabbits, badgers, porcupines, bats, snakes, lizards and other amphibians, and diverse bird populations. A number of ecosystems comprise the canyon vegetation, including pinyon-juniper woodlands, riparian with cottonwood and willow, and other numerous scrub and wildflower communities.

This trip will be pay on your own with two nights at the historic route 66 hotel the El Rancho which has large rooms and was the place where many movie stars stayed when filming westerns. Chaco Culture National Park in NW New Mexico is remotely located and...

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
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In The Mirror: Escape From the Heat

Perspective Gained in Germany

I was one of the fortunate. The timing was spot on and the event sounded just right. (Most importantly my wife encouraged the idea!) Earlier this month I returned from a truly spectacular week-long trip to Germany with my fellow MBCA members and friends. I do not intend to get into the details of the trip as that is for another time. Instead I wish to discuss what I saw, what I felt, and what I perhaps really understood for the first time about the position our club holds in the "grand scheme" of things.

Each of us has a unique perspective on what the MBCA is to us as individuals. For some it is a place they can present a technical question on a model of Mercedes-Benz which they own. For others it is an organization they admire for its heritage and camaraderie amongst fellow members and enthusiasts. For myself, and I imagine, most others it is a balance of both.

I knew going to Stuttgart and the surrounding areas that I would see new cars being built and old cars proudly on display. However, what I observed that week which made the largest impression was the way our club is perceived by similar enthusiasts abroad and how we are observed by Mercedes-Benz and Daimler AG. It is an understatement to say the United States is a very important market for the products they sell. And as the leading enthusiast club for the marque in the nation we have a voice and that voice is heard. Our very first stop was a restoration facility. One of the "Pagoda" SL's displayed carried on it an appropriate vintage "Mercedes-Benz Club of America" window decal. Right there in Germany. (I didn't see that coming!) When we visited the town of Affalterbach to get a diplomatic tour of the AMG headquarters they had warmly raised The Stars and Strips for us, bookended at the three-mast entrance by two white AMG banners. They informed us

that indeed that effort was in recognition of our humble group of ambassadors from America.

The warm welcomes were everywhere. But it was the presentation by our tour guide at the Badd-Cannstatt engine production facility where the recognition of who we are and what we do was presented back to us. The very first topic the slide show opened to was the landing page for our website: www.mbca.org. Our front page has dozens of links and hundreds of words on it. The focus our presenter wanted to make was that it was a mere nine of those words which made all the impression in the worlds upon him, and Daimler alike. He read them aloud to the room, "More Than a Car Club, We're a Community". That is what he liked about us.

You see, even in Germany at a factory surrounded by robots and workers toiling away, where connecting rods are assembled to crankshafts and efficiency is the focus of the day, there is conscious recognition that it is the people who are the most important part.

Jim O'Sullivan has organized this trip for members to visit the Baden-Württemberg state in southern Germany for many years. This trip, from what I understand, was unique in that of the 38 members who attended, 12 of them were Desert Stars. I wish to express my sincere thanks to Rich Schulte for being the driver behind that. He made an effort to get as many of us on this tour as he could and we had a wonderful time for it. With a third of the group being Desert Stars, the back of the tour bus was an entertaining place to take in the venues of this expedition. - Matt
